
OVERCOMING OBSTACLES



OUR WORK •

A Father's Place serves 11 counties along the South Carolina coast with five offices. Our fatherhood programs are supported by local, state, and government grants as well as private foundations, companies, and individuals. With this support, we offer services free of charge to fathers in the following counties:

- Berkelev
- Charleston
- Colleton
- Dorchester
- Georgetown

Our five hub offices offer on-site programs and services, both one-onone and in group sessions that teach men...

- Healthy parenting
- Financial responsibility
- Physical & mental healthcare
- Strong relationships
- And more!

Services available to dads include legal guidance in the areas of child support, custody, paternity, and visitation. Our intervention specialists assist fathers to assess their situations, know their rights, and successfully navigate the social service and family court systems. We attend court to meet fathers and assist them in their efforts to reconnect with their children and become engaged fathers so that their families can thrive.

In addition to fatherhood programs and services, we conduct programs for teen boys in high school with our Reality Check program. This program guides young men to make good choices before they're adults, particularly waiting until they are adults to start families.

We also offer a list of resources on our website so fathers in the community have ease of access to information, resources, and a network of staff and peers to help guide them on their way.



homas first came to us with a laundry list of barriers holding him back from being a better father. He had serious health issues that kept him from driving and obtaining his driver's license on top of an open custody case to obtain full custody of his two daughters. While he knew the custody case was the primary goal, Thomas knew he needed help learning to care and raise a twomonth old and one-year old by himself. Struggling with selfconfidence, he couldn't imagine himself being the father he needed to be for his daughters.

After joining A Father's Place fatherhood program, his outlook began to change. Thomas was engaged

and attentive, completing many components of the program including Healthy Relationships and Economic Stability units. However, the Parenting and Co-parenting component gave him what he needed most.

Thomas gained temporary custody of his children and continued to work with AFP. Thomas even obtained the "Realize a Dream" award with a \$500 prize, which he used to enroll in driver's education course.

Now, Thomas has the confidence, resources, and connections he needs to be an even better father to his children. We are so happy to be a part of his journey and watch him continue to thrive.
